#### Preamble



- Our Vice Chairman, Mr. Amit Lohia announced the launch of Seva Grant, a £50,000 grant fund by the SP Lohia Foundation (SPLF) during the Founder's Day celebration in 2022.
- The fund has been specially created to encourage and support Indorama's family of employees in their commitment to active social service and volunteer work.
- The grant's amount ranges from £5,000 to £25,000 and the application is open to all Indorama's employees globally. The grant may provide the seed capital for a new grassroots community project or sustain an ongoing project.
- Seva Grant takes its name from the Sanskrit word, Seva, meaning 'selfless service' and SPLF requests that the applicant be personally involved in the cause to be eligible such as investing personal time and resources to match the support.

# The Guiding Principles



Nature of the Projects	The projects should aim at bringing about a sustainable change in the lives of the unprivileged and should be neutral and unbiased.
Need-based Projects	The projects aim at addressing the critical needs of the beneficiaries and should not just be picked up merely for PR standpoint.
Type of beneficiaries	The projects should preferably aim at benefitting the vulnerable sections of the society that includes the economically disadvantaged, racial, and ethnic minorities, low-income children, the elderly, the homeless, those with chronic conditions, differently able et al.
High value of benefits accrued	The project should have clear goals, tangible performance indicators and measurable outcomes. The outcome should be of high value to the beneficiaries and should benefit many.
Strong Projects Partners	The project partners should have an impeccable reputation and a good track record of implementing community development projects. Note: <b>Project partners must be able to receive funds from the UK.</b> If the organization is unable to, the application will be cancelled.
Sustainability of the Project	The project should preferably be such that it sustains and continue to benefit the recipients even after the project is successfully closed.
Scope of Stakeholders involvement	The project should have good involvement of the Stakeholders, particularly the beneficiaries, both in planning and execution. Ideally, the beneficiaries should own the project.
Relevance of Project Location	The project should ideally be located close to Indorama's locations so that employees can engage in the project in a practical manner and favor supporting our host communities.

That is causing serious health issues, particularly among the elders and children.

(Project Objectives)	<ol> <li>Educating the community on the ill-effects of drinking the available water in its current form</li> <li>Mobilizing them to setup a filtration plant.</li> <li>Identification of Land for setting up the filtration plant together with the Village Council.</li> <li>Setting up of a Water Filtration Plant based on the reverse osmosis technology</li> </ol>	
12. Who will profit from the project (beneficiaries)? What is the estimated number of beneficiaries?	Primarily, over 2000 inhabitants of Jagdishpur village. Later, the facility could be extended to more villages in the vicinity.

Employee's role in the Project	I will facilitate Nandi Foundation's team to engage with the Villagers and elected leaders of the village council; organize awareness sessions on safe drinking water, health and hygiene. Along with my colleagues, I will also help villagers in the maintenance of the Filtration Plant.

With a minimum sale of 2000 liters a day (assuming that each of the 2000 inhabitants will consume a liter on an average daily), the plant will earn a revenue of INR 60,000 a month. The cost of electricity, operator and maintenance can be met with that amount.
